

Denomination of materials/tools in classroom/workshop

Target group:

Everyone who uses working equipment and materials/tools

Naming also helps those studying for a profession in their mother tongue to learn professional words

Method

The equipment in the room is named with name tags, for example: “table”, “wall”, etc.

Tools are labelled with name tags, for example “pen”, “brush”, etc.

Time estimate

Making name tags takes time, but then the method is constantly used for years

Background information for the teaching session:

- use different kind of pedagogical tools in order to teach the immigrants
- improve teaching materials
- develop new kind of materials to use for teaching

Professional competence

- knowledge of different kind of methods on how to teach non-native speakers

Communication and language skills (part of social and personal comp.)

- knowledge of different communication tools

Learning outcomes:

- Vocabulary expands itself
- Learning professional words is faster

Brief description of the method:

- You can use a label printer (Dymo) or self-made name cards that are permanently attached to the object
- Write the names in a clear font
